

## **Attock Center Report Oct. to Dec. 2003**

Student Population 1/10/03: 10  
Student Population 31/12/03: 15  
Counselors: 2



From October to December we have seen our programs expand more into the community and in our walls. Our student population has grown from 10 to 15 students in the pass three months with 3 students graduating from the program. These three students are now functioning in their family with small loans to start their own businesses. Follow-up on them is being conducted bi-monthly.

### **Property Improvements:**

The following projects have been completed by the students to improve the property:

- We have rebuilt the boundary wall so that the property is secure.
- We continue to remove unnecessary trees and jungle so that the property can be used more appropriately.
- We have leveled the area around the main building to improve the appearance and usefulness of the property.
- We have constructed a new paved driveway into the property so that the facility can be accessed from Jail road.
- We have built a wall to enclose a place for goats.
- We have constructed a new bathroom facility for the office building.
- We have completely painted the exterior of the main building and the front exterior of the front wall.
- A new bathroom facility was constructed in the main building for the students with three individual toilet and shower units.
- A new water tank was completed and is in use.



### **Vocational Training Programs:**

As of the end of 2003, we are operating a barber shop and a tailoring shop in the city of Attock to train our students and also to create income for our center. We have two students learning to cut hair and two students who are operating the tailoring shop. As students progress in our program they are given the opportunity to take part in these programs. In the new year of 2004, we

plan to expand our work in these areas. We have given 3 micro-loans to graduates in this quarter also.

### **Attock Jail Outreach:**

We have heard our first programs in the Attock jail to reach out to the addict population in jail. As of the end of the 2003, we have three students coming directly to us from the walls of the Attock Jail. The Jail Superintendent has given us a invitation to help in his facility with those prisoners that have addiction. We hope in the near future to start a weekly 12 step program in the prison.

### **Future Projects:**

As we expand the student population from 15-20 we will be purchasing more bunkers and almariahs in the first quarter of 2004. The maximum number of students we can house in this facility is 20. We will maintain this capacity until new facilities can be built.

In light of the court case being withdrawn against TEAM mission, we are beginning to start new projects on the property. One such project we will start is the farming of the land. We have grant monies to purchase a tractor which will be purchased in the first quarter of 2004. We will also begin raising a small quantity of goats (5-10) and expand to more as we gain experience in this work. We are planning also to begin a chicken industry in the first six months of this year of 2004.



### Special Events:

On November 11, Mark Hausfeld, the Chairman of the board, visited the facility and was our guest of honor for a graduation ceremony. He was welcomed by our students and given a special gift prepared by our students.

We also arranged a Christmas celebration with our staff and their families on December 12

at the Attock men's center. It was a time of celebration of Christ birth and also to recognize the hard work of our staff. We thank God for what he has done in 2003 and look forward to expanding in 2004.
